

# **Water Polo Referee Evaluation System** **(Provincial 'A' level and under)**

## *Regional Level*

Regional level is recognize by WPC,

You must take the same evaluation system for this level.

You can't change something.

You will see in annex.

- Calls against rules:
  - Ball under
  - Ball in hand
  - Obvious calls (knowing what is minor, major and penalty fault)
- Position on the deck:
  - Offensive Referee around 2 meter area
  - Defensive Referee behind the last defensive player
- Loud Whistle
- Confidence (showing directions)
- Checking the score sheet

## *Provincial 'C' BC certification*

The referee must concentrate himself/herself on:

- Calls against rules:
  - Advantage rule
  - Misconducts
  - Brutality
  - Proper call on minor, major and penalty fault
- Position on the deck:
  - Offensive Referee moving between the goal line and 4-5 meter area
  - Defensive Referee a meter behind the last defensive player
- Proper signals
- Communication with other Referee
- Knowledge of Minor Officiating
- Knowledge of shot clock:
  - Checking the shut clock and recognize the error, know how to fix it
- Confidence against players, coaches

Provincial 'B' (BC certification)

The referee must concentrate himself on:

- Calls against rules
- Proper signals
- Control of the Pool (behavior)
  - Proper use of cards
  - Misconduct on players
- Position on the deck
- Prepare to be Assistant Referee in Chief
- Communication with the Pool:
  - Other referee
  - Minor officials
  - Coaches, players
- Knowledge of shot clock
